# REFLECTIONS



*LOOKING BACK, LOOKING AHEAD!*

It is hard to believe that as we move through the month of May 2017, I will have served as your Interim Pastor for two years! During this time, we faced several congregational challenges but with God's guidance, we addressed these challenges in a caring and constructive manner. We addressed our differences with an open hand and a listening ear. We made difficult decisions in balancing our budget and reducing the hours for our staff members.

Yet, even during these challenges, God has blessed our church family in so many ways. Our ministries with our congregation and community continues to grow and expand. Our 8:00 a.m. worship service led by its spirited worship team continues to grow in spirit and in numbers. Our 10:00 a.m. worship service is blessed by its music ministry, choirs, praise dancers, bell choir, and drama ministry. Our Deacons, Elders, Bereavement Committee and Circle of Love ministry continue to provide care for our members who are ill, hospitalized or experiencing grief and loss. We continue to learn more about God's Word through our Grace Gatherings, bible studies and home bible study groups. Our Sunday School ministry and youth ministry, CYD continue to thrive under our loving and faithful adult leaders. Our Farrell Learning and Education Center (FLEC) has increased the number of children participating in its after-school ministry. A new Girl Scout Troop was organized at EPC last fall. Our ministry to our neighbors in need continue to be graciously served by our weekly feeding ministry, Mom's Kitchen and our Deacons' Food Pantry. We continue to serve our community through our Philemon Ministry, Boys Scout Troop, AA and NA groups. We have recruited new leaders to serve our church family but we still need to broaden our leadership base and to raise up new leaders. God has blessed us with 13 new members. Our church family continues to be generous in its financial support for our mission budget. Our Finance Committee is working hard to find new ways to increase our income and assets. Our Trustees work long and hard to maintain our church home. We now have a social media team working to upgrade and expand our use of social media. Finally, we are blessed by a wonderful and dedicated staff team.

One of the conclusions of our Mission Study last year was that if our Eastchester Church Family is going to continue to flourish and to have a bright future, that we must reach out with our larger community. After we successfully raised the funds last year to build a new dome with the cross on top of our sanctuary roof, one Elder said that a new dome will not necessarily bring in new folks to our church family. He is right. There are a lot of nice church buildings around our city that are empty inside because they failed to reach out with their communities. We must continue to reach out and to share God's good news in Word and in deed with our neighbors. Our church family continues to reach out with our neighbors through our School Backpack giveaway program sponsored by our Stewardship Committee, our dynamic community music concert sponsored by our Music Committee, the health fairs sponsored by our Presbyterian Women, through special services such as our Revivals, Good Friday and Watch Night services, and our Evangelism Committee and Men's Group going out and meeting our neighbors. Our Presbyterian Women even went out in the cold weather last December to sing Christmas Carols during Advent for our neighbors coming thru the Gun Hill subway station.

During the past year, we continue to expand our partnership with community groups to open our doors and to connect with our neighbors. Last year, we hosted the 47<sup>th</sup> Precinct Community Council meeting and community meetings for New York State Assembly Member Carl E. Heastie. On May 16, 2017, we will host the 47<sup>th</sup> Precinct Police Summit and in August we will host a community event for Bronx District Attorney Darcel Clark. During these community meetings, we have taken the opportunity to build new partnerships and new relationships by welcoming our neighbors and telling them about the life and mission of our church family.

During these past almost two years, we have been blessed by God with many opportunities to serve one another and our neighbors. As our church family looks forward in securing a new Senior Pastor, the future for our church family is bright and is fill with lots of wonderful new possibilities to grow spiritually, numerally and missional. Praise be to God!

Make this craft to display a bit of springtime year-round!


**What you need:**

- An old shirt
- Tempura paint (brown, dark pink, light pink and white)
- Paintbrush
- Light blue or white construction paper
- A paper plate
- Q-tips
- Paper towels



**What you do:**

1. Roll up one sleeve and paint your arm and the palm of your hand brown.
2. Lengthwise on the paper, carefully place your painted arm and hand, with fingers spread apart. (This is the tree trunk and branches.)
3. Place the other paint colors on the plate.
4. Using Q-tips, place dots of paint (blossoms!) all over the branches.
5. When dry, display your tree – or give it as a Mother’s Day gift.








