

"Good leaders must first become good servants"



Did you know that when Marines gather to eat, that the most junior members are served first and the most senior are served last? No order is given to do this. Marines just do it! "Marine leaders are expected to eat last because the true price of leadership is the willingness to place the needs of others above your own." This is servant leadership! In his book, Leaders Eat Last, author Simon Sinek uses the United States Marine Corps as an explain of the importance of leaders being focused on their people and mission. Mr. Sinek says this – "These organizations have strong cultures and shared values, understand the importance of teamwork, create trust among their members, maintain focus, and, most important, understand the importance of people and relationships to their mission success."

As our church family moves forward later this year with new pastoral leadership, it is important that we continue to pray for the leaders of our church family as we move boldly into God's new future. Times are a-changing, both within the church and in our society. It is important to honor our past and traditions but our church family must be open to doing things differently if we are to respond to our changing world. As we move toward our Nominating Committee process in November to nominate new officers for our Session, Deacons Board and Board of Trustees, prayerfully consider if God is calling you as well as others to serve in this leadership role. This is a critical time in the life of our church family as we make the transition to calling a new Senior Pastor. We need servant leaders! It is essential that your new Senior Pastor have a team of leaders willing to work with him, who will together step up and out with God, and to lead our church family into a new future.

This summer, the FLEC Vacation Bible Camp once again opened its doors to the church community and the community at large, as a spiritual and fun loving haven for children.

Camp started on July 5<sup>th</sup> and ended on August 11, 2017, and with the support of the Presbytery, the protective watch of Pastor Phil Tom, Pastor Knight, and the FLEC Board of Directors, the camp was able to fulfill its mission of providing a religious base for all in need. By the end of the program, seventy-two students were enrolled, one less than last year's seventy-three.

This year, the camp theme was, "Super God, Super Camper, Super Possibility", and the curriculum and music embraced this concept. The camp's schedule included Bible Study, music, drama, dance, karate, computer games, sprinkler activity, indoor games, outdoor sports, arts and crafts, and myriad trips. Venues for the trips included, bowling at Gun Post Lanes, New Roc City, the Bronx Zoo, Billy Beeze, the Van Cortlandt Museum, the Track and Field Hall of Fame, Rye Playland, Roller Jam Skating, and the final trip to Bear Mountain State Park, which consisted of a day of picnicking, scooter and carousel riding. Our originally scheduled indoor sky diving trip had to be cancelled, as many parents had difficulty paying for this one. Indeed, the cost of transportation. We welcome any suggestions regarding how to defray this cost, so that the trips can be more affordable for all our campers, and will become less of a financial strain on the camp.

The camp continued to be monitored by the New York City Department of Health, which provides us with our permit to operate, and breakfast and lunch were sponsored by the New York City Department of Education. FLEC supplied the mid-afternoon snacks. Due to the increase in the minimum wage, FLEC was forced to raise its fees this year, in order to meet the cost. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Dr. Hyacinth Martin, who is one of our Board members and an elder in the church for sponsoring one of our campers, and for donating three computers, so that the students were kept happy and occupied this summer. Additionally, kudos to our financial team, consisting of Mrs. Mary Kirnon, Mrs. Minna McGlashan-Taylor and our administrative assistant, Mrs. Marcia Hartley, who worked tirelessly behind the scenes. Appreciation should also be extended to our sexton, Mr. Altamont Jackson, who was ably assisted by Mrs. Heather Allen and Mr. Frank Hall, President of the Board of Trustees; they kept the premises in good shape.

This year's camp staff was comprised of most of our after-school teachers/assistant teachers, five volunteers and a few FLEC alumni. We also received the services of twelve workers sent to us by the New York City Summer Youth Employment Program, (SYEP). These youngsters assisted us in the supervision of the children, and were adored and respected by their charges.

We would love to see more members of the church taking advantage of the services provided by the camp. For the past two years, the FLEC Board has reduced the registration fee for church members, to one-half of what other campers pay, in order to encourage more participation from members. We would like to thank church members, Tanyka Wilson, James Woolery, Brenda Gayle and Laurie Brooks year and the years thereafter. We are pleased that this year we had four young women from the church, who had volunteered in previous years. They are: Angela Domfeh, Angelina Domfeh, Akosua Domfeh, and Rachel Jessamy. Kudos to them, as they continue to be four of our best workers.

A representative of the Presbytery paid us a surprise visit on the last day of the program. We were delighted to have her, and the feedback was positive. The program ended with a fabulous closing exercise, led by the camp co-director and Bible Study teacher Mrs. Carollin Carol-Simms, praise dance instructors, the Domfeh sisters, and contemporary dance instructor, Mrs. Angela Ortiz. The concert comprised of religious songs, verses, praise dancing, African and hip hop dancing. This year the undeniable talents of our campers, the cooperation of the staff and the team work displayed by the parents were inspiring. The older campers "rocked the house" with a lively African dance that they had beautifully choreographed by themselves.

Although there were one or two glitches, overall I would like to commend our parents for their assistance and ardent cooperation. The parent of camper, Vanessa Williamson, Pastor Franklyn Williamson, did a fabulous job chairing the closing exercise. Another parent, the mother of Andell and Shandell Pippins, provided the refreshments and extra lighting for the concert without being asked. A third parent, the mother of camper, Chloe Foster, Mrs. Nandi Foster, accompanied us on one of our trips and helped to serve the lunch. On the last day, when we were under duress with wrapping up the program, she willingly bought flowers to thank our Master of Ceremonies, and made us have one less item to worry about. This is the type of team work which makes us realize that even if the program is not a money maker, it bonds the community, serves as a quiet ministry which makes our youngsters, staff, and parents more aware of God's goodness and blessings, and brings a ray of sunshine and purpose into the lives of many people.


These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

### What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Baking sheets (sprayed)


### What you do:

- 1. Place apple slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
- 2. Place apple slices on the sprayed baking sheets in a single layer.
- 3. Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.

### What you need:
